Noncustodial parents in Nebraska can now make child support payments online without sharing their bank account information with the state. The payment is secured, verified and processed within one business day, which helps avoid late payments due to insufficient funds or stop-pay notices on checks.

There are no convenience fees for choosing this option, but the bank account used must be an SVP-enabled account. [SVP was developed by the Electronic Payments Association](#) to reduce paper checks and increase use of the Automated Clearing House Network.
